We need Board members here.



Contingency Fund

Our By-Laws call for the inclusion of a Contingency Fund. The money in a Contingency Fund is like an unspecified Reserve fund. The Contingency Fund can only be used for financing critical or emergency actions by the Board of Directors for which no reserve funds are available.

The Reserve Funds exist to pay for expected future major expenditure, like equipment replacement like a new truck or major repair like repairing the roads.

A Contingency Fund is an unspecified Reserve designed to cover the cost for an unknown significant expense.

This year there have been three contingency events. First the Covid Pandemic resulted in lower earnings from Rental Income. Though this was not disastrous it could have been. Second, errors in tax filings over past years have resulted in significant proposed fines and additional unplanned tax payments. Third, was the unexpected need to hire a lawyer. Though the magnitude of these events is still undefined. the Contingency Fund would be a method of relief.

Remember our By-Laws call for a Contingency Fund. Other Escapee Parks have a Contingency Fund. We should have one as well.



Park Attendants Phil and "Rudee" Rubeck

Phil and Rudee really weren't planning to work this winter. They had just left their jobs in South Dakota (Brrr) last month and

stopped for visits in Indiana before heading to Bushnell, Florida, when they spotted the no-



tice that the Florida SKP Resort was seeking a park attendant couple. Now they are parked on Site G-16 and sharing their experience and skills with us.

They have both brought lots of expertise to their position. At home in Lebanon, IN, Rudee worked for Blue Cross/Blue Shield, then at Travelers Insurance as a claims' adjuster, both auto and home, retiring from Hartford Insurance so she is very familiar with office work. Phil started his working years as a fireman then later as a paramedic before assuming patrol duties as a sheriff's deputy, retiring as a lieutenant from the Boone County, Indiana, Sheriff's Department. Phil and his partner were acknowledged in The Journal of Emergency Medical Services for their rescue of a young boy who was drowning in a trough under a barn floor and used cold water protocol to save the child. Phil was listed in the

1986 edition of the *Outstanding Young Men of America*, and he is a past Master of a Masonic Lodge.

Phil and Rudee grew up in Plainfield, IN and were high school sweethearts there. They have 2 children: a daughter in Jamestown, IN and a son in PA, and 4 granddaughters and a grandson.

The couple has had some crazy good times with other folks. At a rally of an organization in Madison, WI, a few years ago, they discovered that Phil wears a Size 22W tights.
