2022 ANNUAL MEETING AND ELECTION

Packets for the annual meeting and election were distributed on January 17. You will find a lot of reading material inside, 63 pages worth. That's why the Search and Election committee held an instructional session to introduce the new proxies, and the Bylaws committee held a session to make the members familiar with the first 3 proposals. There are a total of 7 proposals – the last 4 from the Standing Rules Committee.

There are 5 candidates running for 4 vacancies on the Board of Directors. You will find a ballot enclosed in your packet. The candidates, in alphabetical order by last name, are Frank King, Skip LaPlante, Denny Luppens, Dick Pearce, and Skip Pratt. For members who will not be attending the meeting in person, your votes on the proxy and on the ballot must be returned to the Secretary in time to arrive at the Florida SKP Resort on or before February 19, 2022, the Saturday before the annual meeting. It is very important that you sign your proxy and that you sign the back of the return envelope. Otherwise, your votes won't be counted.

SKP RESORT RESERVATION and CANCELLATION POLICIES

Reservations

• Reservations are accepted on all available sites except Dry Camping.

• Reservations for the Fall/Winter 2022-2023 season will be accepted starting in April 2022 (exact date and time will be announced on the website). Reservations can be made up to the end of April of the following year.

• The best way to make a reservation is to call (863) 735-1499 and provide the information and payment details at that time.

• Reservations are not confirmed until the Park has received payment or credit card information.

• A 100% deposit is required for reservations of less than thirty (30) nights. Reservations for greater than twenty-nine (29) nights require a one (1) month deposit.

Guests may use the **Reservation Request Form** to make reservations, however, credit card information/ payment will be needed to confirm the reservation. For that reason, a phone call is recommended.

Cancellations

• A full refund (minus a \$100 cancellation fee) is provided if the cancellation occurs more than twenty-nine (29) days prior to the first day of the reservation.

• A 50% refund is provided for cancellations within fifteen (15) to twenty -nine (29) days prior to the first day of the reservation.

• There is no refund for cancellations less than fourteen (14) days prior to the first day of the reservation.

NOTE: Members' sites are used as rental lots. Members may return to their sites with eight (8) days prior notice. Rental guests may be moved to another available site if the member returns.

FROM YOUR SAFETY COMMITTEE

As always, we remind walkers to carry a flashlight when walking in the dark. Reflective vests and clothing are recommended too.

As we watch delivery vehicles speed through the park, our blood pressure rises a little. When a driver comes to your door with a much awaited package, be sure to thank him and put in a few gentle words reminding him/her of our 10 mph speed limit. It can't hurt and it might help.

When we drive on SR 64 we drive along with the traffic at 60 while many pass us at 65 or 70. It's when we turn into the park we need to take a deep breath, lift our foot off the gas and drive into the park at a leisurely 10 mph and slow down to enjoy our leisure.

All this is said to remind all of us that everyone plays a part in Park safety. Everyone needs to be aware of our speed as we enter and drive through our neighborhood.

We surely do enjoy a visit with our neighbors. Let's just make sure we stay safe as we visit by staying on the grass at the edge of the roads, not in the middle of the street.

Golf carts are multiplying "like rabbits" in the park. Golf carts must follow all the motor vehicle laws just as cars and trucks. That does mean drive on the correct side of the road, not down the middle.

Here are a few suggestions from the Safety Committee regarding them.

1. Golf carts should have working headlights and tail lights.

2. Golf carts should have a working signaling device (horn, bell etc.).

3. Members' Golf Cart should have a fire extinguisher attached to the cart. As of winter 2021 all park-owned carts do have them.

4. We highly recommend a rear view mirror be mounted on the golf cart.

While discussing mirrors, they add another level of safety to bicycles too. Ones that velcro on your wrist work so well in letting you see a car following you. They adjust very easily. Look for Mylops or any other adjustable rotating mirror that wraps around your wrist. You can also attach a mirror to your bike handlebars. Good ideas with the new quiet cars on our streets.



We would recommend the purchase of golf cart liability insurance as protection for members and the Park should damage/injury occur.

We would point out that the Mail Room now has a motion-detecting light that comes on as soon as the door opens. This should help members safely enter and exit the Mail Room at night and early morning.

If you have safety issues that you want addressed, or questions for your Safety/Emergency Committee please address them to the S/E Committee and we will discuss them at our meetings.

We welcome any interested members , and guests, to join the Safety Committee. Members can select this committee on the sign-up sheet in your Annual Meeting packet. Guests should watch the boards for meeting notices.
