



Recently, I had the privilege to talk with the Milliards about the Wi-Fi system in the park. First off, I would like to commend the Milliards for a job well done, engineering, creating, and maintaining the park's Wi-Fi system, since the hurricane of 2017 wiped out the previous system.

Based on some of our conversations, here are some tips to get park, cellular, or private internet at your site.

Many of our rigs have metal in the walls that inhibit radio waves from passing through to the living quarters. The idea of a Faraday Cage comes to mind. If you are having problems with the park Wi-Fi, or cell phone service inside your rig, see if your phone or laptop works better outside. If it does, a Wi-Fi or cell phone booster inside your rig may be helpful. Even then, the booster may need to be in a window, or have an antenna that sticks outside.

The clubhouse is also a great place to get good internet via the park Wi-Fi. There are nice comfy chairs in the library. The disk-shaped antennas on each end of the clubhouse are the strongest in the park.

The "Landry" Wi-Fi tower is the weakest in the system. It has been flagged to be first on the priority list for future improvements.

Each of the Wi-Fi access points in the park has a 2G, and 5G option. 5G will be faster if your device is newer, but the signal will get weaker as you get farther away. 2G is said to be better at penetrating walls, but may not be as fast.

If you see "disk" in the park Wi-Fi name, those are the access points closest to the modem. The "book" access points extend the signal from the "disk". The "rabbit" access points fill in the gaps. If you move around the park, you will need to connect to a new access point each time you are out of range. If you select "auto connect," as you log into each new access point, as one access point disconnects, the next one should connect automatically. My phone does this well. This is great when moving from your site, to the clubhouse, to the laundry, out to the pool, etc.

My wife and I travel all over, and we have learned to have multiple options for internet. We have Verizon on our phones, AT&T in the truck and a Tmobile Hotspot in the rig. I am surprised at how well T-mobile works in many rural areas, including the SKP park. We have a cellphone service booster with an antenna outside to improve our chances of getting cell phone internet. We also have a Wi-Fi booster to use as needed if we need to boost the free park Wi-Fi.

The board approved a park wide Wi-Fi upgrade in March. These improvements

## **From the Safety Committee**

### It's That Time Again!

It's time to pump up the *Caring and Sharing action* as we prepare for the departure of many guests as well as members. April is here and we all know that means people will be closing up park models and securing RVs in preparation to head to cooler climes.

Most important, remember your RVs and Destination Trailers must be tied down before you leave them for the summer. Park models must have tags in the windows showing their registrations as we do get visits from the County to make sure we are all conforming to their requirements.

Snowbirds leaving signals that hurricane season is heading our way. The Emergency & Safety Committee is passing on the following reminders. Storms can be fierce here and winds can be outrageous. It's imperative that those leaving their sites take responsibility for ensuring that summer residents and the park are safe from flying objects during stormy weather.

Secure **YOUR** site so others won't be put in danger from flying pots and furniture.

- Put away flags and flagpoles
- Put away patio furniture and chairs
- Put away garden tools and equipment
- Put away trash cans and grills
- Put away plant pots



Anything you can hold with your hands could become a torpedo in a heavy wind or storm. Do not leave plants outdoors if you are not here to care for them or able to move them indoors in case of storms.

- Remove detached steps and store safely
- Turn off propane and water
- Turn off electricity if you are not keeping your a/c or humidistat running
- Close and lock hurricane shutters/awnings
- Close and lock windows; cover with reflective materials if desired
- Check sheds and homes for leaks and loose shingles. Repair before leaving.
- Clean out behind sheds. Loose items cannot remain outside during the summer.

Consider leaving an extra key with the office so they can check if any damage occurs.

### **Summer Residents:**

It is important for everyone to band together to keep yourselves and the Resort safe.

Deb Mowers' Green Beans served at the Valentine's Day Dinner were also a fan favorite. Here's the recipe.



## CHARRO BEANS

Ingredients: 1 Pound dry pinto beans Water as needed 1/2 pound bacon 4 Roma tomatoes, chopped 2 onions, chopped 1 green pepper, chopped 2 jalapeno peppers, seeded & chopped 1/2 bunch fresh cilantro, chopped 1-12 oz. can chicken broth 2 cloves garlic, minced 2 teaspoons salt 1 teaspoon ground black pepper 1 teaspoon Chilli powder 1/2 teaspoon cumin

#### Step 1:



Place pinto beans in slow cooker. Cover

slow cooker. Cover with water and let soak overnight. Next day drain, rinse, and drain the beans again.

### Step 2:


Cook bacon in a large skillet over mediumhigh heat until almost browned and crispy (5-7 minutes). Add the cooked bacon, tomatoes onions, pepper, cilantro, and garlic to the pot of beans. Add broth, salt, pepper, and spices. Cook on Low for 8 Hours or until beans are soft. Make sure the water line is above the beans and keep on a slow boil.

Serve and enjoy alongside your favorite South-of-the-Border eats! Ingredients: Fresh green beans, blanched and cooled Drizzle of olive oil 1 Tablespoon of butter 1 Tablespoon of minced onion 1/2 teaspoon minced garlic 1/2 Cup cherry tomatoes, cut in half

**GREEN BEANS** 

Heat olive oil and butter. Add green beans, onion, garlic, and tomatoes. Heat until hot and beans are tender crisp.
