Departure Checklist

The Safety/Emergency Committee provides this checklist to help keep our RVs and homes safe during summer storms. Storms can be fierce here, and we must prepare beforehand.

- Put away flags and flag poles
- Put away patio furniture and chairs
- Put away garden tools and equipment
- · Put away trash cans and grills
- Put away plant pots. Remember: anything you can hold with your hands could become a torpedo in a heavy wind or storm.
 Please don't leave plants outdoors if you are not here to take care of them; move them indoors in case of a storm.
- Remove detached steps and store them safely
- Turn off propane and water
- Turn off electricity if you are not keeping your a/c or humidistat running
- Close and lock hurricane shutters/awnings
- Close and lock windows; cover with reflective material if desired Check sheds and homes for leaks and loose shingles. Repair them before leaving.
- Clean out behind your sheds. No loose items can remain during the summer.

Summer Residents: Everyone needs to band together to keep the Resort safe. Make sure the Office knows you are staying this summer so you receive important texts and Constant Contact emails.

It is important to help prepare the clubhouse and pool for storms as well.

- Put away pool equipment and toys
- Put away pool furniture
- Put away any loose items around the outside of the clubhouse

Pickleball Court

Everything starts from something. Our journey to an official Pickleball Court has taken five years.

When Dave Mayo became a member, he called and asked about having Pickleball. As a result, we built a court downtown at the water tower on a concrete pad provided by the town. Bob Lewis then asked us to do a Pickleball demonstration on Palm Way for Cracker Capers. Interestingly, the width of our roads is the same as that of a Pickleball Court. With patience filling the road's cracks each year, Pickleball has never left Palm Way. Finally, Cathy Landry proposed an official Pickleball Court. The concrete base of a regulation Pickleball Court is now in place. By early April, the concrete will be cured adequately to be painted.


The application of paint has seven steps, and we expect the painting will be a 2-week process, weather permitting. The final two coats of paint are tough layers of green vinyl paint. It may be painted before the end of the season. More likely, we will line the concrete with special Pickleball tape, allowing anxious people to play on the concrete surface until the fall. After painting, we will install a permanent net. This will allow people to practice and play at any time. Equipment, paddles, and balls will always be available at the court for everyone, although a good paddle is relatively inexpensive. Many RVers carry paddles, allowing them to play wherever they travel.

Footwear is essential—no sticky soles or sandals. Sticky soles make going backward difficult and dangerous. Most sneakers are fine.

Many thanks to the people mentioned and those who participated in the construction. Listing those involved in the construction would amount to about 20% of the park. Special thanks to visitors and Wait List members Steve and Diane Smith, who previously built a court and served as consultants to the project.

Our park advertises the availability of Pickleball, and many visitors have come to our park because we have Pickleball.

Everyone is invited to play.


